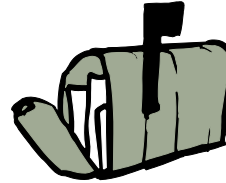

It was the winter of 1881, when Eliza A. Cox formed The Woman's Missionary Society. The name was changed in May of 1948 to USFW. Through the years the purpose has not changed: to unite Friends women in fellowship and service; to stimulate spiritual development with program devotionals and reading course books; to cultivate Christian stewardship; to educate and support mission work among Friends; to connect with USFW International via the *Advocate* publication and Triennials.

Eliza used Micah 6:8 as a challenge to the ladies in 1881. It says: "And what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" What is USFW doing today? We continue to do justice, love with kindness and walk with God, doing his will.

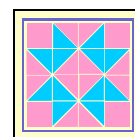
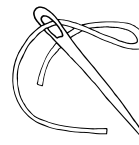
### Know Your Iowa Board?

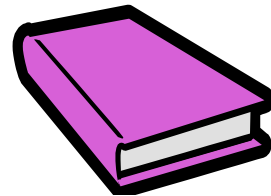
## **Read any good books lately?**

Who has a few good books to read.

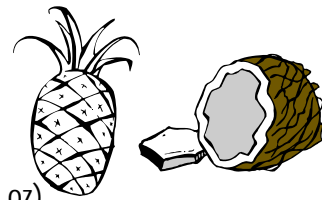
## FOOD FOR THOUGHT

What a delightful day we had at Camp in October! There were several requests for the dessert recipe. I got the recipe from Bonnie Minter, President of the Chester Society. She often uses sugar-free ingredients, and now that there are some reduced-sugar baking mixes, this one could be just as tasty for a lot less calories! Enjoy.

Pineapple cake: 1 yellow cake mix-Bake as directed on package except divide batter into 2- 9 x 13 pans and bake in 350 degree oven 15 minutes.

- 3 pkgs. (3.4 oz. size) instant vanilla pudding mix
- 4 cups cold milk
- 1, 8 oz. cream cheese softened
- 20 oz. can crushed pineapple drained
- 2 cups heavy cream whipped or cool whip can be substituted (Or 2, 8 oz)
- 2 cups toasted coconut



Beat pudding mix, milk and softened cream cheese for 2 minutes. Stir in drained pineapple and spread over cooled cakes. Spread whipped topping over pudding mixture and top with toasted coconut. Better if allowed to sit in refrigerator for several hours or overnight. May also be frozen for several weeks.

For those of you who will be trying new cookie recipes this holiday season, keep track of the tastiest. Iowa USFW will provide the Welcoming Tea at FUM's 2005 Triennial Sessions in Des Moines, and we will need HUNDREDS of cookies. What an opportunity (Evelyn Cook) to display good old Iowa hospitality. There will be more information on this at our Spring Fling in Grinnell.
