

Dr. Bob Carter to Visit Iowa in March

Dr. Bob and Hope Carter are Friends involved in missionary work in Africa for over 20 years. They began their missionary work serving FUM at Friends Lugulu Hospital in Kenya from 1985 to 1991 with a vision of utilizing health ministry as a vehicle to demonstrate in practical ways the grace and love of Jesus Christ so that others might also come to know Him and the blessings of His kingdom. Their experiences at Lugulu plus subsequent additional experiences have only served to further strengthen that vision, which has expanded to include the conviction of the transformational power of the gospel in the lives of not just individuals but also of communities and cultures. Bob will be available to speak within Iowa Yearly Meeting during the first three weeks of March.

A graduate of Earlham College, Bob is the son of retired Friends pastor Wayne Carter, who also served FUM in the past as both Presiding Clerk and later interim General Secretary. Bob is a family practice physician with a master's degree in public health, while Hope is a physician's assistant with a master's degree in community health education. Together, they both studied tropical medicine at Tulane University and completed a certificate program in Biblical Studies from Moody Bible Institute.

They are now looking forward to tackling a new assignment but in familiar territory. In August they will move to Nairobi to coordinate SIM Kenya's new "HOPE for AIDS" program. "HOPE" stands for Home-based care, Orphans and vulnerable children, Prevention, and Equipping the Church. While in Nairobi the Carters are looking forward to interacting with Kenyan Friends.

Iowa Yearly Meeting's Missions Emphasis Friends Theological College Kaimosi, Kenya

FTC is an undergraduate college that trains Friends' ministers for leadership in East Africa. It is a ministry of Friends United Meeting. Patrick Nugent serves there as principal, and his wife Mary Kay Rehard teaches on the faculty and helps with administration, planning, and communications. Their daughters, Emma (15) and Eliza (12) are in school in Kenya. Patrick and Mary Kay have served at FTC since January, 2003.

Please pray for us as we continue the work of educating spiritual leadership for Friends in East Africa. The new meeting-house is very nearly completed—just a few finishing touches remain—and we look forward to a very joyous dedication service on Sunday morning, February 11, 2007. The members of the General Board, from the US and East Africa, who are meeting in Kakamega, Kenya, the preceding week, will be present. We are also delighted that our new academic dean, Angeline Savala, has begun serving on our staff and is making crucial contributions toward better organization and curriculum management.

Several faculty members are continuing to pursue their master's degrees, a requirement for upgrading to a degree program. Please keep them in your prayers.

Finally, we are in the planning stages for introducing the first phase of our bachelor's degree program—a two-year degree completion program for those who already have their Diploma of Theology. This will mark a major milestone in the life of FTC. Please continue to pray for us as we design and implement new programs for pastoral training, and please continue to pray for our family.

After a year of hard work, good friendships, but plenty of frustration, Mary Kay has concluded that her medical school experiment should be deferred for the moment, partly because of our ministry finances—her tuition has been well-supported, but our children's tuition is in serious deficit, and our account is still in a weak position, even after Patrick's 5-month deputation. We are immensely grateful to our long-time supporters as well as our new friends, and we remember you daily in our work and prayers. We are your eyes, ears, and hands here in Kenya, doing the work for which you have commissioned us. May God bless you richly.

Bloomington-Muscatine Friends shares the story of the Prayer Jar...

"Let us not give up meeting together as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching." Hebrews 10:25

Who are they? When did they stop coming? One by one people have stopped attending. Where did they go? Why did they leave? We at Bloomington-Muscatine Friends have been trying to find a way to bring back people who have disappeared from our meeting.

"And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints." Ephesians 6:18

In November we put a prayer (cookie) jar at the front of the sanctuary along with paper and a pencil, and 3 simple instructions; 1) write the names of people who either don't know Jesus or who have fallen away from their relationship to Him on a piece of paper and drop it in the jar, 2) nobody looks at the names in the jar, if you put in a name you are the only one who knows that name is in there, and 3) we all pray for the "people in the jar" in our personal prayer life and also as a church every time we have a meeting or church service.

We all have family and friends that because of where they live can't come to our church, and our job as Christians isn't to bring people to our church, it is to bring people to Jesus. So therefore, we pray that God will bring them to Him wherever they are. We don't know if God will someday make us a big church or keep us a small church who does big things, but either way we are grateful for the work He calls us to do.

The jar was only supposed to be until Christmas, but it has been suggested that because it is working, to continue the project. Many people have seen God at work in the lives of the people they have put into the jar and this is causing a lot of excitement for the people putting the names in.

On the last Sunday morning service on 2006 we had 10 people from 4 different families in our church that haven't been here, some for many years and some for only a few years, and some never. But they were in the jar and now they are here, and we are thankful for God's answers to our prayers.


