GOOD NEWS

Let us consider a few things in closing out 2009 and then take a look at 2010.

In this calendar year we have completed the Capital Campaign "A Future and a Hope". We did not meet each of the goals we set out but took some very large steps toward securing a future for lowa Yearly Meeting. The Tall Oaks Lodge at Camp Quaker Heights was constructed and is in use. Each year now we are seeing an increased usage. We also closed out the Cedar Rapids property sale and added it to the Church Extension permanent funds, while also receiving additional assistance from two different estates. This is enabling us to help bring the **Friends** Church West into reality. Our new church venture in West Des Moines, under the leadership of Michael and Janessa Lock, has just completed the search for a pastor to come and help plant this endeavor. Rich and Patty Kopp will be arriving from Ft. Collins, Colorado by January 1, 2010 to assume the role as pastor. Through the leadership and prayers of Church Extension for over two years we are now seeing the fruit being born. This new work will continue as a Preparatory Meeting under Middle River Friends.

Let us not forget the two Missions families that were commissioned and sent forth from Iowa this year. Sam and Becky Barber (Belize) and Nathan and Brianna Martin (Cambodia). And we have commissioned Morgan Martin to work with InterVarsity at Coe College. These are significant callings from God to spread the Good News both here and abroad. We will be called upon to continue to support all of them in prayer and finances.

We had a devastating storm hit Eldora, lowa and our Camp Quaker Heights. I am happy to report that the restoration is completed from the contractor's side of this work. The total cost of the damage reconstruction is approximately \$350,000. According to two different storm adjusters comments it was the worst hail damage they had seen in over 25 years of adjusting. There were literally thousands of hours of volunteer workers cleaning up and helping to restore CQH to a ready position. We have a new office to build yet and we actually made several upgrades or improvements to different buildings in this process. There are projects that still need completion and workdays will be called in the future by Linda Garrison, our Camp Administrator, who also received extensive damage to her personal home. Having Chip and Alicia Daleske on site has been a very important component to making this all come together in such a short time. We have one final piece of insurance work to complete and that is finishing the "loss of income" portion and that will be addressed shortly.

2010 appears to be ready to bring it's own share of challenges and good news. As we complete the 2009 budget year we are on track to finish in the black and move forward with confidence. Our God reigns and is leading and directing us in many different ways at this time. Isaiah 52:7 is the verse we are focusing on for our new year and the plans are underway for another enjoyable and fulfilling Annual Meeting July 29-August 1. Before that event, your General Superintendent would like to pick up the challenge of encouraging Quarterly Meetings to not forget one another. July 9-11, 2010 are the dates for Winneshiek Quarterly Meeting to be held at Sturgeon Bay Friends at Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin. It would be another great time of fellowship and encouragement for us to round up a bus load to make the trip up to worship together. Some of you will remember what a great time we had in 2003 when we held our Spring Body of Representatives there. What also has me excited about this idea is that July is the time when the cherry orchards should be ready for picking. What a beautiful sight it is to behold this scene which just happens to be in the middle of one of the most famous travel locations in the upper Midwest. We are going to be looking into a bus trip that should be another moment to remember. More information will be sent out in the coming weeks.

So far this year, dues have been paid for 219 members. We are almost at the end of the calendar year, which is the fiscal year for USFW International projects. If you still have funds to send in, it is helpful to send them undesignated, or at least check the latest Advocate to see which projects still need money the most. If funds are sent for a specific project, they must go there, even if the total is over the budgeted amount. When undesignated funds are received late in the year, the USFWI board can allocate them among the projects which still need money the most. It is wonderful when all the projects can be funded in full.

Thank you to all the local societies; you contribute so faithfully year by year to the USFWI and Iowa projects. Even if you think your contribution is very small and insignificant, when combined with money from all our societies and with those from other Yearly Meeting USFW groups, there is enough to do a great deal of good in spreading God's kingdom.

May you have a Blessed Christmas season, remembering and being grateful for the Greatest Gift ever given, the gift of God's own Son to provide our salvation and enable us to have a close relationship with Him, in this life and for eternity.

Then he takes the book off the shelf and looks through it. His face furrows into an angry frown. The old atheist was convinced that Christians, by promoting the weak and ineffectual Jesus to keep the weakest, spiritually diseased, morally unfit and inferior parts of the population alive and reproducing, were a malign influence on civilization and would be the ruin of us all. He thought he'd delivered a death blow, and now he finds us still at it.

I love imagining him standing there angry and appalled, beard smoking, astonished that these weak, inadequate, ineffectual and unfit Christians are alive still, and still reproducing. "
