December FUM Ministry of the Month* Kaimosi Hospital

When Friends United Meeting agreed to take over the management responsibility of Kaimosi Hospital in 2006, we knew it was a step in faith. Even though the hospital had been held in high esteem in its earlier history, the prior two decades had been rough and the hospital was on the verge of closing. East Africa Yearly Meeting turned to FUM for help. After all, the hospital is very much needed in this densely populated area of Kenya and is a great opportunity for Friends to answer Jesus' call to care for the "least of these" (Matthew 25) in His name.

The General Board agreed to a subsidy of \$50,000 a

year for the hospital. They also appointed a Task Force to monitor progress and present regular reports. So far, you have succeeded in meeting this commitment, but the need is still great! You may make donations to: (1) the Hospital General Fund for medicines, utilities, etc.; (2) Adopt-A-Nurse which helps pay salaries; (3) Eden
