These verses speak to all of and about us. What will be our legacy, one of faith or one of uncertainty? In 2013 we celebrated the 150th year since Iowa Yearly Meeting was organized. This year, 2014, we want to look to the future and develop a clear picture of where we are going. We all stand upon the shoulders of those who have gone before us, so the question that remains is what will be our legacy?

This year's annual sessions plans include new ideas and things we have been doing will be changed or rearranged. Instead of a number of small workshops we will do two large group presentations with multiple presenters. Also in place of the workshops we desire to hold what is called a *World Café* style meeting. More will be revealed about this meeting time in the next few months, but I am excited about the prospect of what this can mean for all of us. It has been 19 years (approved in 1995) since we developed a working vision statement for the Yearly Meeting. It was in 2001 or 12 years ago that IAYM approved the current operational priorities. With the fact that knowledge itself is doubling now every eight years and with the rapidly changing technological advances that are influencing our every waking moment, it feels appropriate that we deliberately meet together for planning. By together it is intended to bring people from teenagers to octogenarians to the same table, at the same time for the same purpose. Then it is the desire of planning to allow open and creative conversation from table to table to see what God is saying through our people of all ages. That makes me get excited to just think about it.

Another major event would be to hold Meals from the Heartland event, with the children thru the most advanced in age and wisdom to share together in assembling meals to feed people that are in poverty or starving. This will require funds being raised in advance and coordination with William Penn and the sponsoring group. William Penn is already on board, and we could assemble 20,000 meals in two hours on Saturday morning if we put our hands to the same task.

There are some additional changes in the planning stage which includes hearing messages from several of our own thirty something age pastors rather than an outside speaker. Remember we are trying to plan for our future and to encourage and develop future leadership. Stay tuned for next month's announcements. About this time last year, the lowa Yearly Meeting and the Mesquakie Friends Board gave me the opportunity to become director at the Mes-



quakie Friends Church. First, I was hired as the interim pastor for three months. Then in May of 2013, I was hired fulltime as the pastor and director. Thank you to the Iowa Yearly Meeting and the Mesquakie Friends Board for allowing me to continue to serve as the Pastor/ and Director.

The Wednesday night services we are seeing anywhere from 30 to 60 children. We still pre-pare a meal for them and have classes after-wards. There are a few more adults attending and helping. We have been introducing more worship to the kids. The projector has been a real blessing for both services.

The Sunday morning services are gradually increasing in numbers, along with this in-crease, I am seeing the commitment to Christ and the ministry at Mesquakie Friends.

On the Mesquakie Settlement there is a growing interest in the Mesquakie Friends ministry, I would call it an "awareness." This is true for the surrounding communities as well. Keep us in your prayers.

Christmas 2013—We have received more than enough funds for the gifts for the children. The gifts consisted of items such as; bags, nail polish, perfume, jewlry, hats, dolls, remote control cars, Legos, and other thing. It has also been a time to share in the blessings of watching



IOWA UNITED SOCIETY OF FRIENDS WOMEN William Penn University Scholarship Fund Guidelines

Following are guidelines for the selection of candidates for Iowa United Society of Friends Women William Penn University Scholarship. The Scholarship Committee shall consider applications for scholarships and make decisions as to recipients.

- The amount of the scholarship will be determined by need of the applicant and by funds available.
- The candidate shall be a participating member of Iowa Yearly Meeting.
- A candidate from Iowa Yearly Meeting shall have successfully completed secondary education requirements and shall have been accepted by William Penn University.
- Applications must be received by April 14, 2014.
- To be considered for a scholarship for the succeeding academic year, recipients must submit a request to the committee each year.
- Scholarships shall only be awarded for a maximum of four (4) academic years.
