Some of our members have asked already but I want to share how the Iowa Yearly Meeting Finances ended the year of 2014. At the end of November we had a negative balance of -\$19,111.01 of expenses verses income. When we closed the books on December 31 we ended the year with a negative balance -\$275.88. That translates to several churches and individuals giving year end gifts or extra support. I was doubtful on December 1 that we could do it, but again you all gathered and brought extra into our storehouse. I want to say thank you, and thank you to all.

Campus Ministry at William Penn University

Since December 31 and the end of a salaried Campus Ministry position at WPU we are working to redefine and coordinate what is actually happening on campus right now. A new Campus Ministry Committee has been formed unto the guidance of the President, John Ottosson and I. Presently there are four different ministries active on campus. Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Intervarsity, Team Christ and Campus Worship service are all functioning. Campus Worship Service on Thursday mornings is being coordinated by Pastor James Tower from College Avenue Friends, FCA, Intervarsity and Team Christ are all working with a singleness of purpose and that is the Ministry of Jesus Christ for students but each in a different manner and timeframe. Our present task for the Ministry Committee is to clarify how we can all work together in a coordinated fashion. We are having a meeting on February 10th with the intent of arriving at some decisions then. Scott Biddle has been charged with spending up to five hours per week to help oversee that coordination.

Mesquakie Friends Church

On January 31 in a called meeting of the Mesquakie Friends Board, with all members present on or on phone, the decision was made to no longer continue Deneen Ahumada's contract as Director of the Mesquakie Friends Church. All programs and services are suspended through the end of March 2015. Deneen will be paid thru the month of February but her responsibilities were relieved effective January 31, 2015. During the month of March the Mesquakie Board will reevaluate the future direction for Mesquakie Friends and give a report at the Spring Body of Representatives, on March 21 at Fairfield, Iowa.


It is a phenomenal event in itself and is not forgotten by any who have experienced the action.

Thelma May Forbes

March 21, 1919 – January 1, 2015

New Year's Day 2015 meant not only a new calendar, but also a new address for Thelma Forbes who left this world to join her Lord and Savior in heaven. A natural-born teacher, she fittingly leaves behind an outstanding 95-year legacy of life lessons from which we all can learn.

Lesson 1: Gentle Authority. Thelma was warm and welcoming, always smiling, and taking control in a soft-spoken, gentle way. She was never angry and didn't yell or even raise her voice. But, make no mistake—she was in charge of her many classrooms.

Lesson 2: Genuine. Thelma was the same person everywhere. Whether she was in a classroom, at the store, at home, at card club, or in church, Thelma was Thelma. No pretenses.

Lesson 3: Faithful. Thelma accepted Jesus as her Lord and Savior when she was 13 years old. From then on, she loved Him with unwavering devotion that included daily Bible reading and constant prayer. Her faith in God was an every day, all the time thing. Thelma started teaching Sunday School when she was 15 years old, and kept at it until she retired 75 years later—at the age of 90.

Lesson 4: Teacher. Thelma was the original life-long learner whose love of science and wealth of knowledge simply oozed out of her. She was enamored by the world God created, especially the beautiful flowers and the many varieties of rocks. A teacher by trade (graduating from Iowa State Teacher's College in 1940 and Drake University with a BA in 1965,) she was a passionate instructor whose classroom was wherever she was and whoever she was with, patiently explaining her latest lesson to the kids she loved so much.

Lesson 5: Talented. Thelma had a knack for creating, whether it was in the kitchen, with the sewing machine, or via knitting needles or crochet hooks. Thelma was recycling before it even came in vogue, saving everyday items and turning them into incredible craft creations.

Lesson 6: Service. Thelma freely gave her time and talents to help others, as is evidenced by the many clubs to which she belonged. She prepared and served Vacation Bible School snacks (many of them intricate creations!) for 22 years at LeGrand Friends Church. Her treats were so popular, the church prepared a booklet of Thelma's VBS recipes which were given out at her Sunday School retirement celebration.

We will miss her twinkling eyes, kind heart, and open arms. But the life-lessons this teacher leaves behind will long be remembered. A celebration of her life took place January 4, 2015 with Pastor Alan Mullikin officiating. She was laid to rest in LeGrand Friends Cemetery next to her husband, Harry, who pre-deceased her. She leaves behind two children: Larry and Beverly, as well as grandchildren Karri, Kalisha, and Kelly and eight great-grandchildren.

Missions Moment EASTER OFFERING for TANZANIA

Iowa Yearly Meeting Missions Board invites you to help with a special Easter project. Through Ron Bryan's visits to Friends in southern Tanzania we have been given a glimpse of how God is working through a small group of Friends to expand the kingdom of God.

God is using these people to not only grow a church in their own area around Kyela but they have already started five churches in Dar Es Salaam and they are planning how to share the message of God's love in the bordering country of Malawi.

Some people in Iowa have already provided three motorcycles to improve travel so three pastors can move about more efficiently. Friends in Tanzania are choosing to build a church in Kyela that can also serve as their headquarters for Friends in southern Tanzania. **They are doing much of the work themselves and are committed to raising at least 20% of the needed funds for buying materials. The anticipated total cost for the building is \$30,000. However, they are wanting to raise the funds incrementally as they move forward in the process. Right now they need around \$3000 for the materials to raise the walls.**

The Missions Board would like to ask if you would be willing to give a special Easter contribution to provide funding for our Tanzanian Friends to move forward with their hope of completing the walls for this building. Whatever you give will be appreciated. We believe this is a worthy project where we can join God as He leads Friends in southern Tanzania.

Following are guidelines for the selection of candidates for Iowa United Society of Friends Women William Penn University Scholarship.

- The Scholarship Committee shall consider applications for scholarships and make decisions as to recipients.
- The amount of the scholarship will be determined by need of the applicant and by funds available.
- The candidate shall be a

participating member of Iowa Yearly Meeting.

- A candidate from Iowa Yearly Meeting shall have successfully completed secondary education requirements and shall have been accepted by William Penn University.
- **Applications must be received by April 14, 2015.**
- To be considered for a scholarship for the succeeding academic year, recipients must submit a request to the committee each year.
- Scholarships shall only be awarded for a maximum of four (4) academic years.

is offering a college scholarship of up to \$1000 for the 2015-16 academic school year.
