New Year Resolution.....by Tom Showalter

As we begin a New Year, we often consider what resolutions need to be made in our lives. The process of determining what changes are needed requires evaluation and a "tool" with which to measure.

In her book, *Strengthening the Soul of Your Leadership*, Ruth Haley Barton outlines several stages that take place in our lives (more stages to be shared in the coming months):

- The Pre Awareness Stage: In this first stage, "we are not aware that we are in bondage or that we need God to lead us into something more. There may even be good things going on ('the Israelites were fruitful and prolific,' Exodus 1:7)" (pp.88-89). There is great comfort in the familiar, but at some point, we realize or wonder, "Is there more to my experience as a follower of Christ?"
- The Awareness Stage: In this stage, something happens to make us aware that deep within, we have a desire for something more than what we currently experience. "Awareness always calls us to take responsibility for responding to what we are seeing...But when the pain of staying the same is greater than the pain of changing, we are ripe for making a move. Awareness also involves being able to see the possibility of living in a new way..." (p. 91).

Several years ago, I was challenged by some passages of Scripture that convicted my heart:

- * "And we...are being transformed into His (the Lord's) likeness with ever-increasing glory..." 2 Corinthians 3:18 (NIV)
- "For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of His Son..." Romans 8:29 (NIV)
- * Jesus said, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me." Luke 9:23 (NIV)
- * "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Galatians 2:20 (NIV)
- * *"For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God." (Colossians 3:3)*

Do these passages describe your experience as a follower of Christ? They did not describe mine when the challenge came several years ago. The standard by which we measure "success" in our Christian journey should include the standard of, at least, these Scriptures.

As we begin a new year, may we continually look for ways to implement the standards put forth in His Word. May our journey continue (or begin) today and continually move toward Christ-likeness.

2015 Quakerdale Winter Classic ProAM Results 17 Teams with 161 Participants raised \$13,480!

Many hands were involved in making this first-ever cyber golf tournament a success. When the Development Council decided to close the Manning Golf Outing, they also recommended that an alternative fundraising effort replace the traditional event. Their first suggestion was to use a more traditional fundraising letter until something else could be created. After reading the first draft of the fundraising letter, Executive Director, Rob Talbot commented "isn't there something we can do that is closer to actually playing golf than just a letter?" Thus, the Winter Classic ProAM was created!

"The Classic" is a year-end fundraiser and replaces their golf outing normally held in June. "To the best of our knowledge, this is the first golf event to be played completely online using social media." said Daniel Smith, Director of Development at Quakerdale.

161 people participated in the event: 142 from Iowa, 18 from other states within the US, and one international. The event was designed to expand awareness of Quakerdale and its 11 ministries. The event hashtag, #QWC2015, reached more than 71,000 Twitter accounts and left 392,000 impressions. Web traffic increased by a factor of 23 times and page views by 34 times.



There were several categories for players to participate in. These categories were: Professional Team.-Winner was Three Star Bargain Bay for Hope4Healing, Individual players—Winner was Jim & Deb Auen, 50-50 Partner Tournament –Winner was Iowa Yearly Meeting represented by Wes Blanchard, and Ministry Partner Teams—Winner was Manning Campus represented by Jim Auen.

Thanks to ALL who participated and supported the event and help raise funds for the greater work of Quakerdale!

15 teams participated in the 2015 Annual Garrison Golf Scramble that was held at Oakland Acres Golf Course in Grinnell Iowa. The event was originally scheduled for April of this year but was postponed to late September due to inclimate weather. The tournament raised nearly \$2000 for scholarships.

Guidelines

Following are guidelines for the selection of candidates for this scholarship. The Scholarship committee shall consider applications for scholarships and make decisions as to recipients.

- 1. The amount of the scholarship will be determined by need of the applicant and by funds available.
- 2. The candidate shall be a participating member of Iowa Yearly Meeting.
- 3. A candidate from the Yearly Meeting shall have successfully completed secondary education requirements and shall have been accepted by William Penn University.
- 4. Applications must be received by January 31st.
- 5. To be considered for a scholarship for the succeeding academic year, recipients must submit a request to the committee each year.
- 6. Scholarships shall only be awarded for a maximum of four (4) academic years.

The Iowa Yearly Meeting Mission Board announces that scholarship funds are available for adults and youth within Iowa Yearly Meeting for short term mission trips. 
The deadline is March 1, 2016.
