Peace Curriculum Update Prayer is Needed!

The Missions Board would like to provide an update on the Peace Curriculum that has been written for Friends Schools in Kenya. You may remember that funds were collected to help with the printing. The books have been printed, but until an Education Secretary is hired to provide oversight, the program in on hold. FUM would like the Kenya Churches and Schools to raise the money, so they will take more ownership of the program. They may have enough money to have a part-time secretary by the end of the year, but things in Kenya do not move very fast.

Book 1 has Standard (Grades) 1-4 and Book 2 has Grades 5-8. They printed 1,000 of each so they have 2,000 books printed. Last spring (2016) Dana Oswald and her aunt did a training session with about 25 schools and those schools are, we hope, using the curriculum. However, we will not be doing more trainings until the Education Secretary is in place. No one has time to oversee the work until we get that position filled. Dana is willing to go back to Kenya and help with more training after they get a secretary. There will be expenses for holding the workshops—transportation, food, paying for the venue, etc. I don't think they plan to print more books right now.

We are not actively seeking funds yet because we don't know how long it will be before we can hold workshops. However, if people wish to contribute, they can go to the FUM website and go to the Donate page. They have to click on OTHER and write in that the donation is for the Peace Curriculum.

SEEDS is a project to raise funds for the peace curriculum. This year we have 100 acres rented in Kenya for this growing season. They are planting maize and will sell it to the Friends Schools after harvest. Every year it is difficult to find good land to rent from an honest landowner. Last year the person we rented from was not entirely honest and we did not get the full crop from the 80 acres that we rented. That meant that we did not make a profit. We are renting from a different landowner this year and pray for a better outcome. What is really needed right now is **lots of prayer support**. Please join us to pray for this program.

Here are some things to pray for:

- Thank God that the curriculum is complete and 2,000 books have been printed.
- Thank God that we did get 100 acres to rent this year for SEEDS.
- Thank God for the 25 schools that are using the curriculum.
- Thank God for John Muhanji, Francis Makete, and the other SEEDS board members who worked so hard to find land for rent and are currently looking for land for 2018.
- Thank God for the teams (Primary and Secondary) who persevered and wrote the peace curriculum.
- Pray that Kenya churches and schools would get excited about having an Education Secretary and would raise the necessary funds quickly.
- Pray that the SEEDS crop would be profitable this year.
- Pray that SEEDS would find an honest landowner who would rent them land for several years. (They would like to rent 200 or more acres and get a contract for several years.)
- Ask God for direction and grace to keep the project moving forward.

The Friends Response Team (FRT) board met via conference call this past month. Two things were discussed.


