

My Delegation to Iraqi Kurdistan By: Nate Perrin—Pastor of Valton Friends

God has taken me on quite the soul-stretching, faith-growing adventure this summer. Although it is difficult for me to discuss and talk about because of the emotions surrounding my trip, I know that God has called me to discuss this. I pray that your heart is open as well and that



the Holy Spirit convicts you to at least pray. On September 10th through the 23rd, I went on a peace delegation with Christian Peacemaker Teams to Iraqi Kurdistan. Christian Peacemaker Teams, or CPT, is a human rights report group inspired by Mennonite pacifist theology - although any denomination can work with them. Despite many warnings from people, I knew that God was taking me to somewhere unique and special. CPT's main work is working with villages along the border that have been getting bombed from Turkey and Iran. It is intentional violence against the Kurdish people. Violence against Kurdish villages started to escalate more and more during our delegation, although we did not see this violence first hand....

Guidelines

Following are guidelines for the selection of candidates for this scholarship. The Scholarship committee shall consider applications for scholarships and make decisions as to recipients.

- 1. The amount of the scholarship will be determined by need of the applicant and by funds available.
- 2.The candidate shall be a participating member of Iowa Yearly Meeting.
- 3.A candidate from the Yearly Meeting shall have successfully completed secondary education requirements and shall have been accepted by William Penn University.

4.Applications must be received by January 31st, 2018

- 5.To be considered for a scholarship for the succeeding academic year, recipients must submit a request to the committee each year.
- 6.Scholarships shall only be awarded for a maximum of four (4) academic years.

Campus Ministry is alive and well at William Penn University! There are so many activities for a student to be involved in that he or she must choose. These are all connected together by the Campus Ministry Committee which consists of student leaders and the following: Pastor James Tower, Prof. Ron Bryan, Prof. Jeanne Marshall, Scott Biddle, Tom Palmer and Seth Hedman. This year's campus ministry grad assistant is Chuck Sellers.

William Penn shares Seth and Jodie Hedman with Central College. They are fulltime staff with InterVarsity which gives our students contact with that campus and the large InterVarsity family. This includes state and national conferences and a weekly leadership development meeting. This group meets on Tuesday evenings.

Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) is connected to a worldwide movement as well. William Penn places a heavy emphasis on athletics so this is a vital ministry. FCA meets on Wednesday night and has a contact list of over 100 students. Tom Palmer is the huddle leader and receives excellent help from the regional director, Gary Gravert, each week.

The newest group on campus is Team Christ (TC). This began under Spencer Thury's ministry and has grown since then. They have organized Bible studies on campus for Friday and Saturday evenings. On Sundays TC either has another Bible study/prayer group or an afternoon campus worship event once a month. This features students leading worship and speaking.

This year students wanted an evening worship service so Campus Worship is on Thursday evening with various students leading and Pastor James giving support. This includes a full meal provided by community members.

There is also a week-day worship on Thursday s at 11:10 a.m. This is organized by the faculty and also has a meal provided by the faculty or community. Week-day worship is the one time when faculty and students worship together.

All of this has attracted many students and there are some outstanding young leaders at William Penn. There is a religion minor and talk about reinstating a religion major. Your prayers and support of William Penn Campus Ministry is greatly appreciated. Should enough funds be available, the University and many of its supporters would like to provide a Campus Minister again.
