What is That Work or Mission? ... by Tom Showalter

In the 2018 Yearly Meeting message, I shared the following quote:

When it is functioning properly, the Church of Jesus Christ is the hope of the world. It is the only organization that has ever existed that is capable of healing broken lives, pointing people to God, and fulfilling the deepest longings of our souls. It is in the Church that the rejected find acceptance, the sinners receive forgiveness, and the lonely experience love.

The Church, God's Body with Jesus Christ as the Head, is to carry on the work that has been entrusted to it: What is that work or mission? Scriptural Truths about Our Mission:

Great Commission

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go (as you are going) and make disciples of all nations"

Act 1:8

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

2 Cor. 5

17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! 20 We are therefore Christ's ambassadors...

In our 2018 Yearly Meeting Ministry Conference, we adopted a mission statement for IAYM which reads:

The Body of IAYM exists to exalt Jesus Christ by becoming fruitful disciple-makers and expressing God's love by serving all people (John 15:1-17).

Those of us who claim to be followers of Jesus should display something vastly different from the rest of the world's ways: 2 Corinthians 5:17: "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old is gone and the new has come." If we are a new creation, then our behavior should show that. Programs don't cut it, good pastors cannot bear all that responsibility. There are people in our lives, who don't know Jesus, but need Jesus and His help. Our attempts to persuade them, invite them, talk to them, and convince them has had limited results.

We have an amazing heritage as Friends. My simplistic summary of the rich history of Friends is this: I see a people who simply saw needs in their world and met them with the light of Jesus. Friends' founder, George Fox once said, "Christ has come to teach people himself."

A term often used by early Friends was that of "Seeker" or "Seekers of Truth." George Fox was seeking

something he could not find in organized religion. He and many at that time saw the spiritual bankruptcy in the established Church and many other people were trying to find God in some other way and the established Church of the day was not helping. It was into this environment and at this time in Fox's life that he wrote:

"But as I had forsaken the priests ...for I saw there was none among them all that could speak to my condition. (Ever been there?) When all my hopes in them and in all men were gone, so that I had nothing outwardly to help me, nor could I tell what to do, then, oh, then, I heard a voice which said, "There is one, even Christ Jesus, that can speak to thy condition;" and when I heard it, my heart did leap for joy."

"These (early) Friends were concerned to find again the life and power of the early Church" as seen in the book of Acts. The movement grew rapidly and by the time Fox died in 1691 (70 years old), there were between 40 and 50 thousand Friends in England. They had a mission: to be light in darkness and impact those with whom they encountered with God's love for the purpose of their salvation.


"A God-Centered Church" (Blackaby)

- •"Our world does not need to see good people doing good things for God. The world needs to see God doing what only He can do through His people. Is the world encountering God in the way we serve Him?" (p.284).
- •"When people look at your life or your church, do they see the difference God makes?" (p.297).
- •"In all this there is the Lord standing at the door of each church. He is knocking, but He is on the outside. He is begging for someone to hear Him, open the door, and welcome Him to the spiritual table in the church. It seems that He is looking for one. Could you be that one for your church?"

Let me ask you: Do you have family members who have strayed from the Lord or who have never acknowledged their need for Jesus? Do you see your community torn apart from violence, drugs, alcohol, abuse, etc., etc.? Are you aware of marriages and families who struggle for survival? Do you know people who have been diagnosed with cancer or other terminal disease and they and their family struggle to make sense of it? That sounds like mission work to me! How about you?


